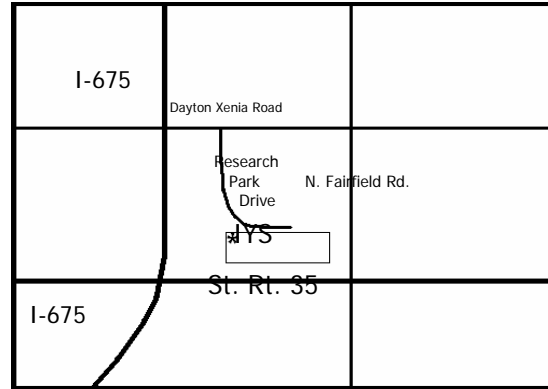

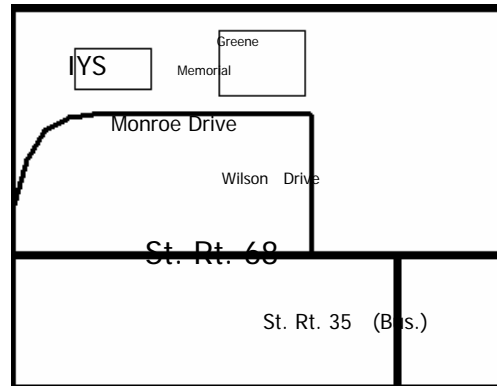
Beavercreek

Your Child's Mental Health

12 Questions Every Parent Should Ask

Does my child....

1. Often seem sad, tired, restless, or out of sorts?
2. Spend a lot of time alone?
3. Have low self-esteem?
4. Have trouble getting along with family, friends, and peers?
5. Have frequent outbursts of shouting, complaining, or crying?
6. Have trouble performing or behaving in school?
7. Show sudden changes in eating patterns?
8. Sleep too much or not enough?
9. Have trouble paying attention or concentrating on tasks like homework?
10. Seem to have lost interest in hobbies like music or sports?
11. Show signs of using drugs and/or alcohol?
12. Talk about death or suicide?

According to the National Mental Health Information Center, if you answered yes to 4 or more of these, and the behaviors last longer than 2 weeks, you should seek professional help for your child.

In Greene County, Integrated Youth Services (IYS) provides for the behavioral health needs of youth and their families with its system of services that includes mental health and alcohol and drug counseling programs.

Youth live within families. Everyone is affected when a child is hurting. A family systems approach is provided at IYS. This means that parents/guardians/caregivers, siblings and extended family may be asked to participate in the services along with the child depending upon the child's needs.



Mental Health Programs

Diagnostic Assessment

Before any treatment services are provided, you and your child will meet with a counselor who will assess the needs of your child and your family and help you in determining a treatment plan that best serves you.

Counseling

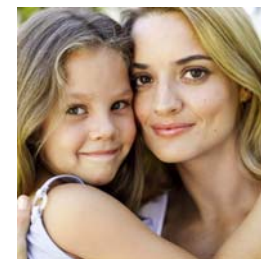
IYS provides counseling services to youth and their families. This is done with the families individually or with the youth in groups when appropriate.

Community Psychiatric Support Services

This service is provided to all families participating in counseling or psychiatric services. The amount and frequency of the services varies to meet the individual needs of the family served. It provides coordination and linkage with outside providers and other child serving programs such as schools.

Psychiatric Services

For youth who experience severe mental health symptoms, a Board Certified Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist is available to consult with the counselor and, if necessary, provide an evaluation to determine if medication is needed. The same psychiatrist would follow the care of the youth to assure the medication is effective.



Crisis Intervention

IYS provides crisis services from 8am-5pm, Monday through Friday. To access crisis services, call 937-427-3837 and ask for the Crisis Counselor.
